

Daily Reported New Positive COVID-19 Tests vs. Daily Reported Deaths from COVID-19 in the U.S.







September was the first month nursing homes were eligible for federal "pay-for-performance" incentives tied to controlling COVID-19. Reported deaths at U.S. nursing homes dropped by 1,217, or 26.7% in September, compared with August while COVID-19 infections fell by 5,131, for a 19.5% reduction. As a result, 10,501 nursing homes will split \$333 million in performance-based payments.¹


Total Deaths and COVID-19 Deaths in the U.S. by Age Group
